BECOME A MAN OF SIGNIFICANCE


WARIA UP

BACKGROUND

The book of Judges tells us what life was like in Israel after the death of Joshua. There was no formal leadership but a series of deliverers (judges), such as Gideon. During the period of the judges a repeated cycle of events took place. Firstly the people turned away from God, often to worship other gods. Then God allowed an enemy to overrun them. Thirdly they cried out to God for help. Fourthly God sent a judge/deliverer to save them. Fifthly, once they were safe and smug, they forgot God again. It was when Israel was overrun and oppressed by the Midianites that God raised Gideon up to bring deliverance. When God called him he saw himself as small and insignificant, a nobody, but God saw him as a mighty warrior.



READ Judges 6:11-14

1. Why do you think there's often such a difference in the way we see ourselves compared to how God sees us?

2. How does God tell us what He thinks about us?

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3. Make a list of all the things you can think of that God calls us. (Chosen, beloved, victorious, etc.)

4. Select one item from the list then share what difference it would make to how you would be at home, at work, and in church, if you really believed what God says about you.



Gideon saw himself as a little nobody, but God told him to "go in the strength you have", which Gideon did, and as they say - the rest is history. With his army whittled down to 300 Gideon won an incredible victory over an army, which the Bible says was like "the sand of the sea shore for multitude". The theme of God using the little we have is also seen in the feeding of the 5000 with one boy's lunch, a widow's cruse of oil that kept pouring out until she had enough to pay off her debts, and Samson killing 1000 Philistines with the jawbone of an ass. God asks each of us to, "go in the strength you have", in other words to do what we can, or to use what little we've got, and He will do the rest.
