# Power of Prayer Brian France

#### **WARM UP**

How real is the power of prayer for you? It became real to me after my hearing had been destroyed by a terrorist's bomb, when 7kg of high explosive detonated a metre behind me and the blast destroyed my hearing. I was serving in Northern Ireland as a Platoon Commander against the Irish Republican Army during what became known as "The Troubles".

The blast destroyed my eardrums and the frequency mechanisms of the inner ear. I asked for hearing aids but was told I did not have enough hearing to amplify and that I had better get used to being profoundly deaf. For three years I lived not hearing speech until I was prayed for by a group of ordinary Christians. Through their prayers God restored my hearing.

I now realise that prayer is the most powerful force in the universe and that its power is available to all Christians. To be effective in prayer we do not need to be spiritual superstars, but we do need to actually spend time in prayer.

## BACKGROUND

Jesus prayed regularly and received significant answers to prayer. He often went to a quiet place to pray, away from other people. Prayer connected Jesus to the Father so that He might know the Father's will. This communication with the Father was so important to Him that He spent many hours praying, sometimes all night. The twelve apostles were chosen as a result of Jesus' all-night prayer and they went on to change the world!

## **CONSIDER THIS**
