# H.O.P.E: Having Our Perspective Eternal David Dishroon

#### **WARM UP**

Hope is a spiritual substance that is related to our souls. Our inner world is vitally dependent upon this most important substance.

A friend's dad was a prisoner of war in Vietnam for eight long years. When his dad was released over 5,000 people showed up at the airport to welcome him home. News media asked him how he managed to stay sane. His answer was simple, "Hope"! He followed it up with his testimony of faith in Jesus Christ.

### **READ** Hebrews 6:15-20

#### BACKGROUND

Abraham is called the "Father of faith". In this passage the writer is using him as an example of how faith and hope (patience) work together. Abraham's faith believed the promise made, however the promise didn't come immediately. He had to patiently wait for it. Other words to define hope are patience or endurance.

This passage identifies several things that make this kind of hope something that is powerful and trustworthy.
