WARM UP


BACKGROUND

Words have a powerful effect on us. "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit." Proverbs 18:21. So we need to constantly be thinking about what we are saying. We will eat the fruit of what we speak. In our relationships with others we need to speak life - words that affirm and build up. It is amazing what we will do for some praise from those we love. Please note that it is not just what we say, but the manner in which we say it. Our tone and body language are also important.

One thing you need to be very aware of: If your spouse or friend has words of affirmation as their love language then they will find any negative words will hurt them twice as much as someone who does not have this love language.



READ Matthew 25:14-23

4. As affirmation is not just verbal but written, write a message that you will later put on a card or letter to a friend, spouse or family member. Discuss with your group for more ideas.

"My purpose in writing is to encourage you." 1 Peter 5:12
