 **READ |** Ephesians 3:20-21

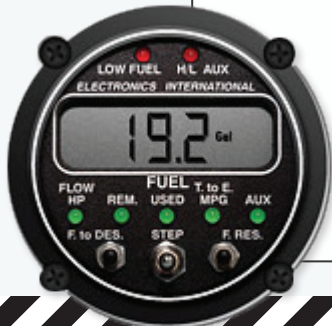
BACKGROUND |

Translating that into this verse reveals that the Holy Spirit enables us to get things done, to advance God's Kingdom. The Holy Spirit is not a pacifier but the Comforter. The word comforter comes from 2 words.

- Com = with
- Forte = strong or strength

The Holy Spirit's main role is to strengthen and empower you.
