Communicating Your Faith Summer 2013

What do you think when you hear the word "evangelism"? For the vast majority of believers something like the following happens: After an initial anxious heart murmur, when they realise they are not about to be gathered up to go somewhere and "evangelise" someone, their breathing settles back to relief mode.

Some may even bring out the well-known "awesome foursome" that is a byword for those who feel intimidated about sharing their faith...

- "I'm not gifted or called to that task."
- "Very few opportunities to evangelise are presented to me."
- "Talking to people about God is an intrusion into their lives and that's not me."
- "God can do it Himself how and when He wants to."

For seven years in the late 1960s to mid-1970s, as a worker with Teen Challenge in the ministry of street witnessing and coffee bar evangelism, I know how difficult it is to encourage Christians to move from the comfort of just being a follower of Jesus, into the exciting and challenging lifestyle of a disciple of Jesus and a communicator of the faith.

Some of my most enduring memories of excitement and enthusiasm come from this period when it seemed the norm to be involved in some form of witnessing. Reflecting back I am sure it is not the exception, but the norm for every believer.

I never considered whether I was gifted to evangelise, or how many opportunities were presented to me. I got caught up with a group of believers in the church I attended and as a new Christian of 28 years of age I followed these people out to the streets, the pubs, the parks and the marketplace to share my faith in Christ. What a wonderful foundation was being laid in my life.

I still recall some of our favourite sayings:



• "If you have been born in the fire you will never be content to live in the smoke."

"Impression without expression can lead to depression."

Not much theology in them I know, but plenty of challenge that leads to commitment.

The **message** of the gospel never changes, and the **messengers** are still required to be faithful to present it. However, the **method** used to propagate the gospel has to fit into the framework of the culture where it is needed.

Presenting the gospel today is not so much an event, or crusade, or witness program, but a process where as Christians

we share a "word in season" or an aspect of our faith in normal relational conversation to those we mix with. This conversation then becomes another point of reference in the spiritual journey of that individual. Other believers cross their path and hopefully are bold enough and sensitive enough to know how to share their testimony, sowing a little more of God's love and care to them, and so the process continues. Many people today come to Christ as a result of these conversational spiritual links being woven into the fabric of their lives.

This is a good foundation for sharing your faith. We also need to consider how the work of God's mighty Holy Spirit is ever active
