The basic Christian Creed affirms God the Father as the Creator of heaven and earth. So what does it mean to be a *creationist* today?

We see all around us what happens to creation when very few people are truly creationists. The world gets trashed! If you're not sure I'm right, go visit Mumbai or Shanghai.

After the Industrial Revolution, creation suffered when human beings became technological masters of the planet and expressed their own self-alienation through domination over other people and things - which is the heart of almost every false religion and secular ideology.

Our technological dominance - turning nature's causes against itself and towards corrupted and greedy human ends - is destroying the earth, which God gave us as His choice gift and the theatre of His glory.

Creation is a complex of matter, which God made and to which He then gave form. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1) but the next Hebrew words in Genesis tell us the earth was tohu wa-bohu - chaotic, formless, uninhabitable and lifeless. God then took the rough matter and turned it to order and system, full of abundance of wisdom and law. Chaos became cosmos (ordered creation) when God spoke for seven days.

Whether these days are literal or figurative is a moot point. The claim is this: God created it all by His command. What was disordered became ordered, became a creation, an exquisite work of art over which we humans have been given care.

Whether any of this occurred by development or evolution is also a moot point and again does not matter an ounce. Not one element of the theological claim of creation is in jeopardy from evolutionary theory.

Indeed, if evolution were true (more on that in a moment) in any of the theoretical forms in which it is dressed, then the author of Genesis would look pretty clever and far-sighted, since the biblical order of creation mirrors what Darwinians think the basic order of life on the planet has been - from ocean to air (day five)



and land, and finally to man (day six) as the end product. The Darwinists have beautiful theories but bad science.

By contrast with our creation story, the popular secular views of creation are twofold. Evolution is not the only or even necessarily the most important game in town any longer.

In the first secular view, matter is god with a little "g". Matter, not spirit, pre-exists and explodes into an evolving, developing and ever-complexifying order in a Big Bang, governed by chance and contingency. The miraculous is taken away from a personal God who is Spirit-being, and given to randomness as its highest power. The random "miraculously" and inexplicably produces order.

This is the basic scientific-modernist account of the world and the universe, our home. The production of spirit (human consciousness) is unplanned, unpurposed, and accidental. Life is pretty well meaningless.

The second secular view I call pantheistic (meaning 'everything is god'). This view is emerging from the incoherence and inconsistencies of the former one. Here matter is given the power of spirit which complexly organises itself from chaos to cosmos, in a self-unfolding of its spirit. Matter is not dead any longer but complex, alive and full of spirit. This is quite an old view really, for even the Greeks said "everything is full of gods".

What distinguishes this emerging secular view is that it unites matter and spirit so that the evolution of the universe is geared toward the emergence of consciousness: the cosmos wants to "know" and evolves our brains so it can know itself. Every form of green paganism (nature religion) and humanist religion will inevitably inhabit this emerging view, but it does have the decided benefit of being ultimately deadly to the neo-Darwinian myth. Some theorists predict that within several generations this myth will be fully debunked.

In reintroducing intelligence and creativity, this new view does come very close to what we Christians would call the Intelligent Design (ID) movement,

which affirms a more traditionally theistic account (ie the view of a personal God creating the world we know). What the ID movement sees in nature is evidence of intelligent purpose at its base and infers the necessity of a Creator from this.

But both these groups agree that the world doesn't just appear random and chaotic but intelligently organising and organised.

In any case, Christians will still exist who witness to the deepest truth: all creation is God-made by one Word which He spoke, the Word who became flesh through Mary. Creation screams His glorious name. He created it and He will be its completion. As the Victorian Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins once put it, "This world is Word, expression, news of God".
